

I first learned of Our Promise Cancer Resources through social media and first reached out to Stacey (whom I knew only casually at the time) in the winter of 2012. I was a relatively new yoga instructor and had been invited by Duke University Integrative Medicine to attend an intensive sixty hour training for Cancer Awareness. The word "Resources" sprang out to me because I was short of the necessary resources to apply. After a gracious conversation, I learned the true mission of this organization. Fast forward to the fall of 2013 when Stacey contacted me, asking if I would be interested in leading yoga to a support group that was meeting at Genesis. My response, "You better believe it!" Next in the saga, another invitation from Duke arrived in my mail that fall and with some generous benefactors, I applied and was accepted to attend the training in the summer of 2014. It was hard and humbling and filled me with hope. Maybe I COULD do something to support the warriors fighting cancer and recovering from cancer and hoping the cancer never returns. There were instructors at the

training from all over the country and Canada. A primary take-away for me was that the other participants in the training were going home to figure out how to get the medical community in their towns to support them, I already had the support of Dr. Tim Webb, Genesis Cancer Center, and Our Promise Cancer Resources!! The gal from Arkansas was ahead of the game.

The yoga classes for these brave souls was moved to my studio at Whittington Place, and because of the generosity of Our Promise, there is no charge to the cancer warriors and a friend to attend. In these classes, the participants have an hour to get stronger, more balanced and flexible in their bodies and minds and souls. And it offers them at least an hour in the day NOT to think about the word cancer. They learn to breathe through the moment; they learn how strong and brave they are. And even on days when all they feel like doing is sitting in the chair and taking deeper breaths, they leave with a more serene demeanor. When the cancer became too much a few days ago for co-honoree and long-time friend, Susan Scarborough Burton, to continue to fight, it fired me up to work even harder, to be more passionate than ever, to give support to all those still in the midst of the battle. I talked to Susan's husband, Brooks, a few hours after she was moved to the hospice floor, as I was driving home from a visit with my own family. I have no idea the intent of the audience of Adam Levine's song, "Memories", but it played on the radio after I talked to Brooks. I then downloaded it and have listened to it many times during these past days. As I share some of the lyrics (Adam's poor grammar, not mine!), I ask that you lift a glass. Cheers to Susan! Cheers to every face and name that are burned into your soul, the cancer warriors, the ones who fought valiantly and now have their rest. . . the ones still in the battle! Our Promise Cancer Resources is here for YOU!!

"Here's to the ones that we got, Cheers to the wish you were here but you're not Cause the drinks bring back all the memories
Of everything we've been through
Toast to the ones here today

Susan S. Burton was diagnosed with Stage 4 breast cancer in the spring of 2016. After completing her last chemotherapy that summer, Susan recovered, SURVIVED. Upon beating those incredible odds stacked against her, she returned to work and to her zest for life, enjoying many trips and concerts with her husband, Brooks, her family, and her friends. She especially enjoyed her role as "Honey", as her grandchildren called her. Susan loved her grandchildren and spoiled them rotten. Her favorite thing was taking them to her "happiest place on earth", the beach. Susan was a tough, classy and independent woman, and her love for those around her radiated from her, even on her bad days. One of her other great loves was service to others who were walking the same road as she. Susan dedicated time and resources to Our Promise Cancer Resources. At the yearly Tailgate fundraiser, she, along with her family and friends, were always so lively and supportive of Our Promise, raising thousands of dollars for cancer patients.

In February 2019, Susan received the news that no survivor ever wants to hear, a new cancer diagnosis. Her breast cancer had moved to her brain. In true Susan form, she began the fight again with radiation treatment.

She fought with strength, bravery and endurance, with her loving husband, Brooks, right by her side. In the early morning of October 1st (ironically the beginning of Breast Cancer Awareness Month), it was time for her to let go. She will be missed every day, but never forgotten, and her name and memory will live on as the Our Promise House comes to be a reality.
